Rules for attribution of EHPRG Awards

The annual European High Pressure Research Group (EHPRG) Awards were established in July 1989 by the decision of the EHPRG General Assembly held in Paderborn, Germany. The aim of the Award is to promote excellence and encourage participation of young scientists and engineers in high-pressure research.

The Award is governed by the following rules:

- 1. The EHPRG Awards is given annually to one or in exceptional circumstances two young scientists or engineers who demonstrated excellence in high pressure experimental or theoretical research. Each Award is accompanied by the prize of 500 €.
- 2. The work nominated for the Award must be related to a high-pressure work carried out in any scientific area and conducted anywhere in the world. For the purpose of the Award 'high pressure' is defined as pressure above 100 MPa.
- 3. The candidate must be a citizen of a European country.
- 4. The age of the applicant should not exceed 35 y.o. in the year in which the Award is given.
- 5. At the time of nomination the candidate is required to be still active in high-pressure research.
- 6. Applications should be submitted to the Secretary of the EHPRG by a senior person nominating the applicant. The application form must be accompanied by a brief curriculum vitae, a two-page report of the work considered for application, the list of publications, invited lectures, communications, posters, and any other documents which can be used in assessing the suitability of the application.
- 7. The applications are assessed by an independent panel of referees and the final decision is approved by the EHPRG Committee and cannot be appealed against.
- 8. The winners are expected to present an oral contribution at the EHPRG Conference at which the Award is given. His/her registration and accommodation costs are covered by the Conference organisers.
